Virginia, to wit:

I, Alfred Moss, Clerk of the County Court of Fairfax County, in the State aforesaid, do hereby certify that the bearer hereof Susan Winkfield, aged twenty years, has long hair of a mulatto colour, has a large scar on the back of the right hand, five feet and one quarter of an inch high, no other marks perceptible, is the daughter of Mary Winkfield who was born free as appears to the satisfaction of the Court. Whereupon, at the request of the said Susan Winkfield and by order of the said Court, I have registered her in my office as a free negro according to Law. Given under my hand this 16th day of April 1855.

Virginia to wit

I Alfred Moss, Clerk of the County Court of Fairfax County, in the State aforesaid do hereby certify that the bearer hereof Dennis Goings, aged about twenty one years, black, has short thick hair, five feet eleven and three quarter inches high no scars or marks visible is a free man of colour the son of Hannah Gray a free woman and born free as appears to the satisfaction of the court. Whereupon, at the request of the said Dennis Goings and by order of the said Court, I have registered him in my office as a free negro according to Law. Given under my hand this 21st day of May 1855.

Virginia, To wit:

I Alfred Moss Clerk of the County Court of Fairfax County, in the State aforesaid, do hereby certify that the bearer hereof Major West, aged about forty-eight years, five feet eleven and three quarter inches high, his face marked with small pox, bald head, no other visible marks or scars, was emancipated by the last will and testament of William Skinner, admitted to record by the County Court of Fairfax County, November 21st 1842. No permission has been granted him to remain in the State of Virginia. Whereupon, at the request of the said Major West and by order of the said Court, I have registered him in my office as a free negro according to Law.

I Alfred Moss, Clerk of the County Court of Fairfax County, in the State aforesaid,

do hereby certify that the bearer hereof William Cartright, four feet three inches high, aged about nine years, black, the right eye a little squint, has no scars perceivable, was emancipated by deed from Thomas J. Carper dated April 16th 1855, and admitted to record in the Clerk's Office of Fairfax County Court April 16th 1855 (no permission has been granted him to stay in the State of Virginia. Whereupon, at the request of the said William, and by order of the said Court, I have registered him in my office as a free negro, according to Law.

I Alfred Moss Clerk of the County Court of Fairfax County, in the State aforesaid, do hereby certify that the bearer hereof, Daniel Cartright, aged six years, three feet seven inches high has a small scar over the inner corner of the right eyebrow, was emancipated by deed from Thomas J. Carper, dated April 16th 1855 and admitted to record April 16th 1855 in the Clerk's Office of Fairfax County Court (no permission has been granted him to remain in the State of Virginia

Whereupon at the request of the said Daniel and by order of the said Court, I have registered him in my office as a free negro, according to Law.

Given under my hand this 16th day of April 1855.

Virginia to wit:

I, Alfred Moss, Clerk of the County Court of Fairfax County, in the State aforesaid, do hereby certify that the bearer hereof Anna M. Cartright, aged eleven years, has short hair black skin black eyes, has two small scars on her neck, a small scar over the outer corner of her left eye, a scar on the joint of the left wrist and one on the upper part of her left hand, was emancipated by deed from Thos. J. Carper, admitted to record April 16th 1855 (and of that date) in the Clerk's Office of Fairfax County Court. She is four feet nine inches high (no permission has been granted her to remain in the State of Virginia

Whereupon at the request of the said Anna M. and by order of the said Court, I have registered her in my Office as a free negro, according to Law.
